### ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Larry Schwab, MFT, LMFT, and Ted Glackman, MEd, will discuss their experience as group co-therapists leading a "mid-life" men's group for the past seven years. They will discuss their methodology, the input they offer the group, and their observations about the evolution of the group process. They will also discuss a recent highlight of their group's experience—a gathering of several local men's groups to view and discuss the documentary *Five Friends* with the featured individual from the film.

### OBJECTIVES

This program should enable you to (1) design an effective group method for men in their mid-life years, (2) list at least three issues that men typically need to discuss with other men in a group setting, (3) describe cues seen or heard that indicate an individual is benefiting from a group session, and (4) apply metaphors and narratives to a group healing process.

### ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

H. Laurence Schwab is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist with a private practice in Media and Wilmington. Since graduating 24 years ago from the Hahnemann MFT program, Larry has been the Director of Family Therapy at The Rockford Center in Newark, DE, and has been involved in the Healthy Communities Initiative in Media. Many of the men in the group initially went to him for individual or couples work and then joined the group to further pursue their goals. Ted Glackman is executive director of the Joseph J. Peters Institute in Philadelphia, a behavioral health program that responds to sexual abuse circumstances. Ted has run men's groups in his private practice for more than 10 years. Ted and Larry began their professional association in 1988.

### CREDITS

### Directions to 410 Baird Rd., Merion, PA (home of April Fallon)

**From the Schuylkill Expressway**, take Route 1 South. Pass St. Joseph's University and Episcopal Academy on the right. The numbered streets on the left will be going up. Pass 63rd St. on the left. At the next light, turn right onto E. Wynnewood Rd. (at the corner is a sign for St. Charles Seminary). If you get to Route 30 you have gone too far. On E. Wynnewood Rd., go to the first light and turn right onto Bowman Ave. Go past the first traffic light; the next street on the right is Baird Rd. Take a right onto Baird Rd. and go to the second white house on the right (410). The house is Country French style, white with dark teal shutters. Park on the right side of the street.
